WHIMPLE STORES 🙈

It has been over a year now since we purchased Whimple Stores from Mark and Jenny and what a tumultuous year it has been for us since! We have been made very welcome by the people of Whimple and have learned that Whimple is very unique both in the origins of its population and its strong social cohesion and active community involvement.

We have been blessed with very good present and past staff members in Karen, Sarnia, Rebecca, Karina, Judith and Lynn who, bar one, are also Whimple residents. They all reflect our ethos of making our customers feel welcome and going the extra mile to be friendly, helpful and informative. We would like to thank them for their support and dedication over the past year.

Since February, we have faced new challenges that all small shop owners are experiencing with accelerating wholesale prices of products, downturn in sales as a result and the tripling cost of electricity to power the lights, fridges and freezers.

Despite these challenges, we have tried to keep our prices down and to be reasonably competitive with the big supermarkets to avoid customers having to drive to Ottery St Mary, Honiton or Exeter. As a result, we have a lot of regular customers, know most of them by first names and have a regular chat or joke with them, making this a real community shop.

We have supported Whimple events by selling tickets and by advertising in our windows and have a rotating charity box area on the counter. We have a "temptation" table near the entrance with bargains or new lines and have a free children's books and toys box on the floor so please watch out for these on your way in.

The Post Office has been a significant challenge for us both financially and in the time commitment needed to fulfil their demands without sufficient remuneration. We consulted with the village on how the cost of retaining and running a Post Office counter could be met and only one helpful suggestion was made which would require fundraising across the community. The suggestion was made unfortunately at the same time when a clerical error by the Post Office resulted in a demand against us to compensate the loss that did not exist. We had to spend an unacceptable amount of time demonstrating their error and removing their financial demands. This was the final straw and we have terminated our contract with the Post Office and will be closing the counter on January 6th 2023.

We plan to have a Payzone Terminal for bill payments, electricity and phone top-ups and will support cash withdrawals at the shop counter for up to £50 with a small fee to cover our costs. We will also stock the main types of stamps.

We are planning to run a parcel service for sending and receiving but the companies concerned have not yet provided a firm commitment despite months of discussion so there may be a gap in service.

The nearest Post Offices to Whimple for other services are in West Hill, Ottery and Cranbrook, and an Outreach Post Office arrives in Talaton on Wednesdays.

In the run up to Christmas, we will be open every day at the usual times except on Christmas Day. On the following public holiday days we will be open but the Post Office counter will be closed. Please see the centre spread of Whimple News for the full opening times.

Don't forget that we have Christmas Cards, wrapping Paper and postal boxes.

We will provide pre-ordered Christmas food as usual and can also bring in bulk packs of drinks from our wholesalers if you need. We also have access to catering size frozen foods such as large cakes and frozen meats such as duck and lamb. Ask for prices and quantities if you are interested.

Finally, we wish everyone a very relaxing and sociable Christmas and thank all our customers for their support over the last year.

Tuesday 17th January 2023 - Wassailing

This year's wassailing will start at the Heritage Centre at about 6.30pm for the usual 'rehearsal'. We'll then move off at 7.00pm towards the rear of the Heritage Centre where the first Wassail ceremony will be around the Society's Whimple Wonder tree.

The procession will then head up Church Road to Lower Woodhayes Orchard for the second wassail ceremony.

We'll then move back to the Square, via Dince Hill Close, where the procession will gather near the tethering stone to remember the Society's first Chairman, John Shepherd.

Onwards then along Town Lane and Broadclyst Road to the orchard adjacent to Knowle Cross Farm for the third and final ceremony of the evening, courtesy of Jim and Mary Chard.

The last port of call will be at the Cricket Club for traditional Wassail refreshments.

We would urge everyone to enter into the spirit of the evening by wearing traditional dress and bringing 'instruments' that will make sufficient noise to waken the trees and ward off any evil spirits in the apple trees.

Wassailing Mugs and T-shirts will be on sale on the evening.

A-wassail, a-wassail! The Moon she shines down; Our apples are ripe and our nuts they are brown, Whence thou mayest bud, dear old apple tree, And whence thou mayest bear, we sing unto thee.

Steven Spielberg was once asked "What do you hope God will say to you when you finally see Him?"

And Spielberg thought for a moment and smiled. He replied: "Thanks for listening." -Thanks for listening.

It's a good answer. So much of the Christmas story is, truly, about listening.

When Gabriel arrives to bring Mary the news that she will bear a child...she listens.

When the angel tells Joseph in his dreams what is about to happen...he listens.

The shepherds listen when the angel announces the "good news of great joy' then they go out and tell the world what they have seen.

And the world listens.

Two thousand years later, we confront this stunning message – "tidings of comfort and joy" as the carol describes it – and our hearts swell with the sentiment of the season.

It comes to us with the clang of bells, a blare of trumpets. The rip of wrapping paper. The laughter of loved ones around the table and into that, unexpectedly, comes Christmas. Quietly. Gently. Whispering with the angels: "Rejoice. Rejoice, because we are not alone. God is with us. Emmanuel."

My friends, on this miraculous night, the message I want to leave with you is so simple: Listen. With your ears. And with your heart.

Our salvation has been announced. What will we do with it?







A Window on Whimple's Weather - September/October 2022

Welcome to the fifth instalment of weather summaries for 2022, from Whimple's two weather stations; Slewton Crescent and Cobden Lane. This report presents data collated from both sources.

Live and historical data sets are available for each station, through the links, above.

September – Started with the very warm and sunny weather seen at the end of August but quickly gave way to thunderstorms and very heavy showers on the 4th and 5th. One shower in Slewton Crescent registered a downpour rate of almost 170 mm/hour making the 5th the wettest day of the month with over 17 mm rain. Total rain for the month was 77 mm, above the average of 60 mm; however, half of this fell in the 3 days of 4th- 6th. Though average sunshine was recorded, September was generally a warmer month than usual, with an average high temperature of nearly 20°C (18°C being the long-term norm for September). However, the cold second half of the month delivered night time low temperatures only slightly below average, despite the very cold night of 18th (2.2°C).

October - Like September, October was also an extremely warm month with day time temperatures regularly 5°C above average, the warmest day registering 20°C, on 1st of the month. The average maximum temperature was nearly 18°C as opposed to the more normal 15°C for October, with slightly above average sunshine. The 11th was the coldest night with a close-to-freezing minimum of 0.6°C. The end of the month saw the side effects of Storm Claudio bringing very blustery weather to Southern England, with winds in excess of 38 kph recorded by Whimple's weather stations on 31st. October was wetter than normal, registering 104mm of rain (the average being 90mm) and there were 16 rainy days recorded, as opposed to an average of 12 for October.

Thank you Santa, just another quick ques.....





We live in interesting times. Such is the state of the country at present, but this is not the first time, as one remembers the 'omnishambles', which was first used in the House of Commons in April 2012, as Ed Miliband noted that *"even people within Downing Street"* were referring to the 'omnishambles budget' - the word first appeared in TV's, The Thick of It. In October this year a new word has been entered into the Collins English Dictionary - 'permacrisis' - describing the feeling of living through 'an extended period of instability and insecurity'. With the war in Ukraine, inflation hitting a record high, the cost of living increase and political instability, it is certainly a poignant phrase.

Collins's lexicographer Mr Beecroft stated, "Language can be a mirror to what is going on in society and the wider world, and this year has thrown up challenge after challenge. We are living through upheaval caused by Brexit, the pandemic, severe weather, the war in Ukraine, political instability, the energy squeeze and the cost-ofliving crisis".

There is, on the positive side, the place, our village, our community where we come together, because by the strength of our common endeavours we can achieve so much more, than we achieve alone. POW+R Group reflect this virtue, as we are currently examining the EDDC Local Plan and its impact on our village as well as writing the first draft of our Neighbourhood Plan alongside the Parish Council.

Proposed consultation draft local plan

Since December 2021, the District Council's Strategic Planning Committee have been meeting to consider a new Draft Local Plan. This plan sets the suggested policy approaches to a range of subject matters and it has now produced its consultation draft plan. The Consultation on the emerging new East Devon Local Plan 2020 to 2040 started on the 27th October 2022, which includes a series of face-to-face exhibitions to outline the EDDC intensions. Whimple's meeting was held on the 29th November. However, there is another chance nearby at Feniton, Youth Centre on Tuesday the 13th Dec, 3pm to 7pm. The consultation closes on Sunday, January 15th 2023, so please take a look at the plans, including the possibility of large-scale developments bolted onto Whimple. Your comments are vital if we are to preserve our village. POW+R Group believes in the importance of 'localism' (decisions taken at community level) and that through our own Neighbourhood Plan, we indicate what we need, what we want and what we are prepared to accept. The EDDC link is <u>Have Your Say Today - East Devon Local Plan - Commonplace.</u> The emerging proposals include substantial levels of development on the western side of East Devon, with these including a second new town and also employment growth. Proposals provide for 'modest' growth, a vague term to describe development levels in other parts of East Devon. This will focus on development being directed to the towns and villages with the greatest range of services and facilities.

The New Fountain Inn

As at the time of writing, in early November the New Fountain is slowly being redeveloped into a pub for the next generation of villagers. It seems there is still some way to go, as there was a lot more work than Kevin, the new owner, had expected on the inside. The projected opening will be realistically sometime in March 2023.

Cranbrook Expansion

After the long awaited Planning Inspector's report on the Examination of the Cranbrook Plan, which critically affects the parish of Whimple, there were a large number of amendments and significant modifications, including safeguarded land for Suitable Alternative Natural Greenspace (SANGS) to provide a 'buffer zone' between Cranbrook and Rockbeare and Whimple.

The expansion of Cobden's areas of Cranbrook and their general location were, according to the Inspector, already established in the 2016 Local Plan. The Cobdens Area will have around 1495 new houses with types of property to reflect the location of development. The national agenda is to raise the bar on design standards. This is critical, as it gives us the right to challenge the design and layout when details are submitted for those properties built in our parish. There are proposed clusters of houses, being in the north-west of Lower Cobden Farm, of approximately 500 dwellings within our boundary, and clearly contrary to the wishes of local people. POW+R Group will monitor and challenge, if necessary, any development likely to affect our villages.

Whimple Neighbourhood Plan

Having gathered the evidence from various sources, including the village consultation weekend, questionnaires and letters, plus the original 2018 survey, group members and key parish councillors, the task of evaluation is now being worked on in detail. Some of the categories within the Plan have already been written up based on the evidence gathered in the consultation.

We aim to have our Draft Neighbourhood plan, available for village consultation by mid-February 2023. There will be further information in the next Parish Mag, with full appraisal and details of the draft proposals which will be observed by the Planning Officer for NP's at EDDC.

If you want to be part of the process to 'Protect our Whimple and Rockbeare' we'd love to hear from you! The Neighbourhood Plan will be achieved by: Ambition, determination, cooperation and you. Let's make this work for our future rests on the 'We love Whimple' NP.

Booking Appointments and Ordering Medication

We have been running our flu clinics since October, and in that time our wonderful team of nurses and GPs have administered more than 2300 vaccinations to eligible patients! We have plenty of flu vaccination clinics set up, so please do contact us to book your appointment.

Due to the volume of patients who need to book their vaccinations we would like to thank everyone for using the automated telephone system and text message booking service to book, cancel and check their flu vaccinations and other appointments. Using these services helps to reduce the queues that build in our phone system.

Patients can also access appointment booking options, their medical records and repeat prescriptions through the NHS App and SystmOnline.

We kindly ask our patients to order any repeat prescriptions when they are due, not too early and to not leave this too late either. For quality and safety reasons our Medical Administrators are not permitted to interrupt other patient consultations to organise an urgent prescription. Repeat prescriptions can be ordered via the NHS App, by completing a request slip in practice, at your chosen pharmacy, or by speaking to a Medical Administrator on the front desk. The surgery will accept a prescription request up to 10 days prior to the due date. Once the practice has received your repeat request, please allow 2 working days for the practice to process it and send it to your chosen pharmacy. Your pharmacy will require time to make up your prescription, and this time can vary between pharmacies so please be aware of this.

By the time this issue comes out, we will have celebrated the life of our Mum, Barbara Lambert, who died peacefully in October. Many thanks for all the lovely comments and cards.

Many in the village, won't have known Mum, she'd had mobility issues for many years and dementia for over six, so was out of general circulation for some time. However, Mum was known in Whimple for a couple of noteworthy things.

A keen and knowledgeable plants-woman, Mum could regularly be seen at the Produce Association's annual plant sale, selling a variety of hardy perennials which she'd grown either from seed or from cuttings. She also entered flower arrangement and homecraft classes at Whimple Flower Show and received cups several times over many years.

Mum's other, even longer passion was music. She trained as a primary school teacher, specialising in music and taught at Feniton until retiring (early) in 1983, after which, she taught recorders at Whimple School and was involved in a local music centre, based in Ottery. In about 1975, Christmas Eve Carols in the Square took place for the first time, led by Geoffrey Brace, a local musician who lived in Whimple at the time. Geoffrey moved out of the village after that 1st year, and Mum took it on, writing out music, mustering musicians and encouraging people to join in. As you probably know, I still run this very popular event, with a band who turn up and play every year, sometimes with about 18 musicians of all ages. It soon became *the* way to start Christmas for us and many other families.

We regularly collect for the Devon Air Ambulance, at the carols, but in memory of my Mum, I'm planning to collect for Dementia UK this year. I hope you'll be able to help us to support this charity who help families facing Dementia.
